About the Performer

New Hampshire violinist Richard Clark began studying at the age of 7, continuing through high school at the New England Conservatory Preparatory in Boston under Magdalena Richter and Jin Kyung Joen. He is currently a student of Carla Trynchuk at Andrews University, as a recipient of the Dare to Dream Scholarship. He will graduate in May, 2017, with degrees in music and physics. As a member of NEC's elite Youth Philharmonic Orchestra he has performed in numerous concerts in Boston, as well as touring Europe with performances in the Rudolfinum in Prague, the Smetana Festival in Litomysl, and the Musikverein in Vienna. During that time, he was also the 1st violinist of the Genesis Quartet, a group selected to perform at the Monadnock Music Festival, and the New England Conservatory Chamber Music Festival in Jordan Hall. He is currently the 2nd violinist of the Nova Quartet, which performs extensively for events at Andrews, and the surrounding areas. An active soloist, he has appeared with the NEC Baroque String Orchestra, premiered composer Rodney Lister's work "A Black Matter" at the NEC Contemporary Music Festival, and toured British Columbia and California as guest soloist with the Canadian University College Chamber Orchestra. In 2012 he toured South Africa with the New England Youth Ensemble as soloist and orchestra principal, and was invited to return on the group's 2015 tour of Australia, where he performed in concerts from Brisbane to Sydney. In 2016 he performed with the Andrews University Symphony Orchestra as a winner of the Young Artist Competition. He has performed in master classes and workshops with renowned musicians including Nicholas Kitchen, Ayako Yonetani, Kurt Sassmannshaus, Rachel Barton Pine, The Borromeo String Quartet, and Yo-Yo Ma.
