WANTED: A LOGO

James White Library has a strategic plan, a guiding philosophy ("Beyond Walls"), an online system ("JeWeL"), and a web homepage. It does not have a logo.

The lack is about to be remedied. A campus-wide contest is being conducted just now to design an appropriate logo which can be incorporated into library publications, the web homepage, printed forms of various kinds, and perhaps incorporated in new signage being planned for the library building.

Anyone with an Andrews University ID is eligible to participate in the logo contest, and the winner will receive a cash prize of \$100 plus the satisfaction of seeing his or her design displayed in public ways.

To qualify, entries must be on white paper (up to 8 1/2 x 11), in a sealed 8 1/2 x 11 envelope with name, ID number, address, phone number and status and turned in at the library circulation desk. Accompany the entry with a brief statement explaining why the design or images were used. Deadline date is Friday, February 9.

Anyone interested may obtain a submission form, with contest rules, at the library circulation desk.

JAMES WHITE LIBRARY TO HOST TELECONFERENCE SERIES

On Friday, February 2, James White Library will be a host site for the first of three double-session teleconferences designed for paraprofessional library staff. Following last year's success with a similar video conference series, "Soaring to Excellence", the

College of DuPage at Glen Ellyn, Illinois, is producing this year's series in cooperation with the National Institute for Library Personnel.

Libraries and the Internet, and Successful Team building will be the topics at the February 2 three-hour down-linked session. Remaining sessions on March 1 and May 3 will deal with other topics of current interest to library assistants. There is a \$12 charge per session, and attendees may arrange to receive continuing education credit.
