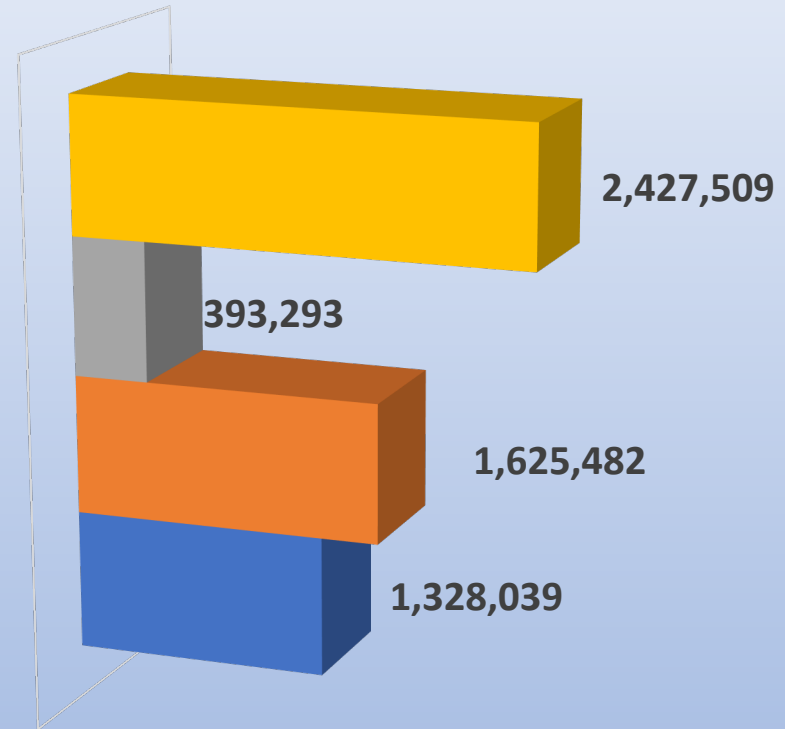

Marital Status

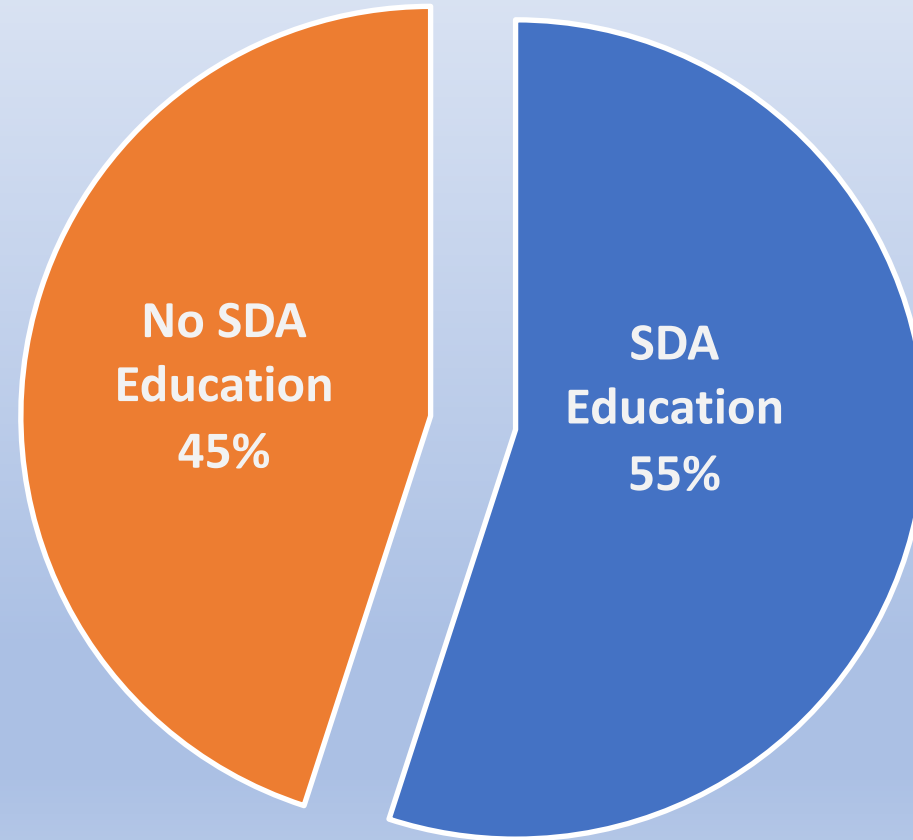

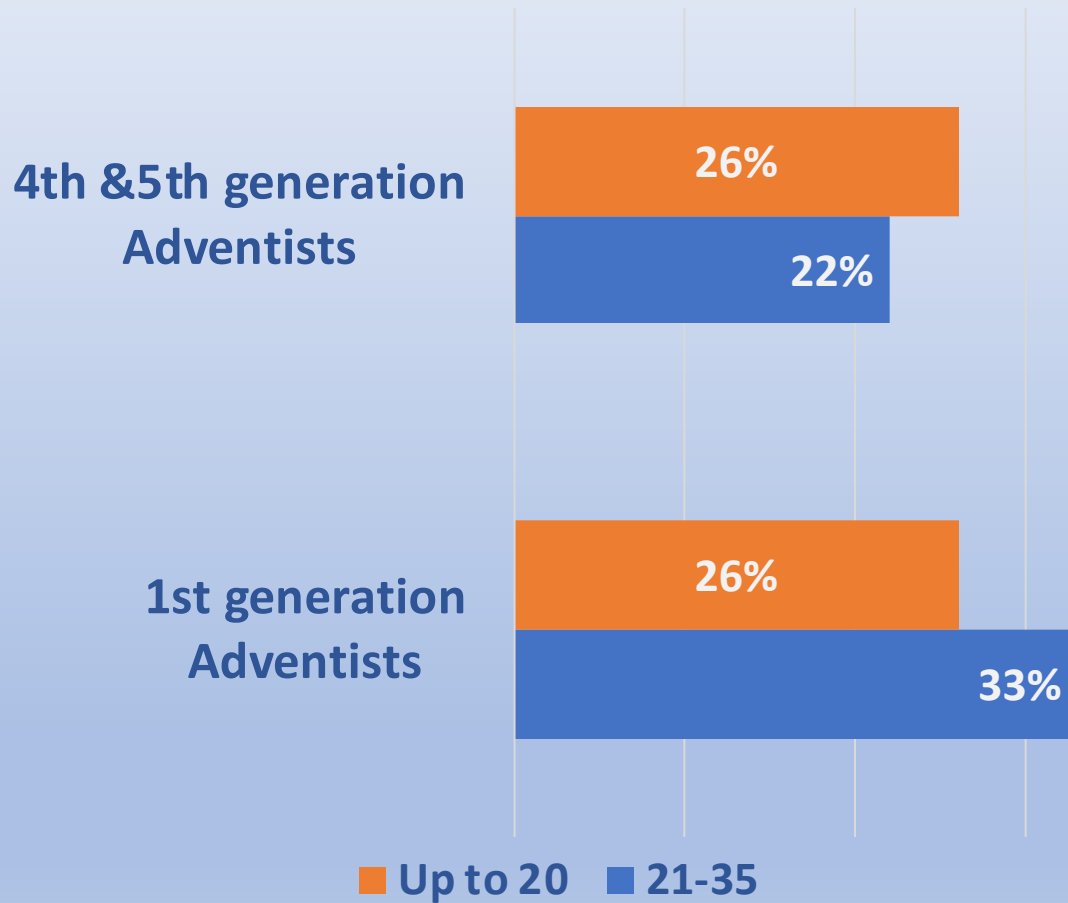

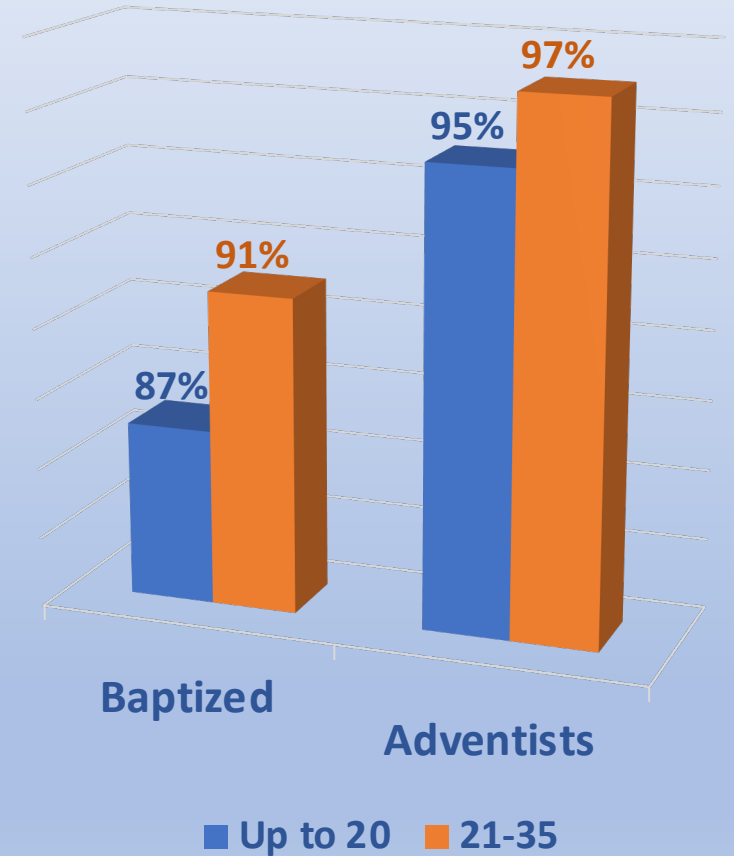
A significant number of young people around the world have not had Adventist education

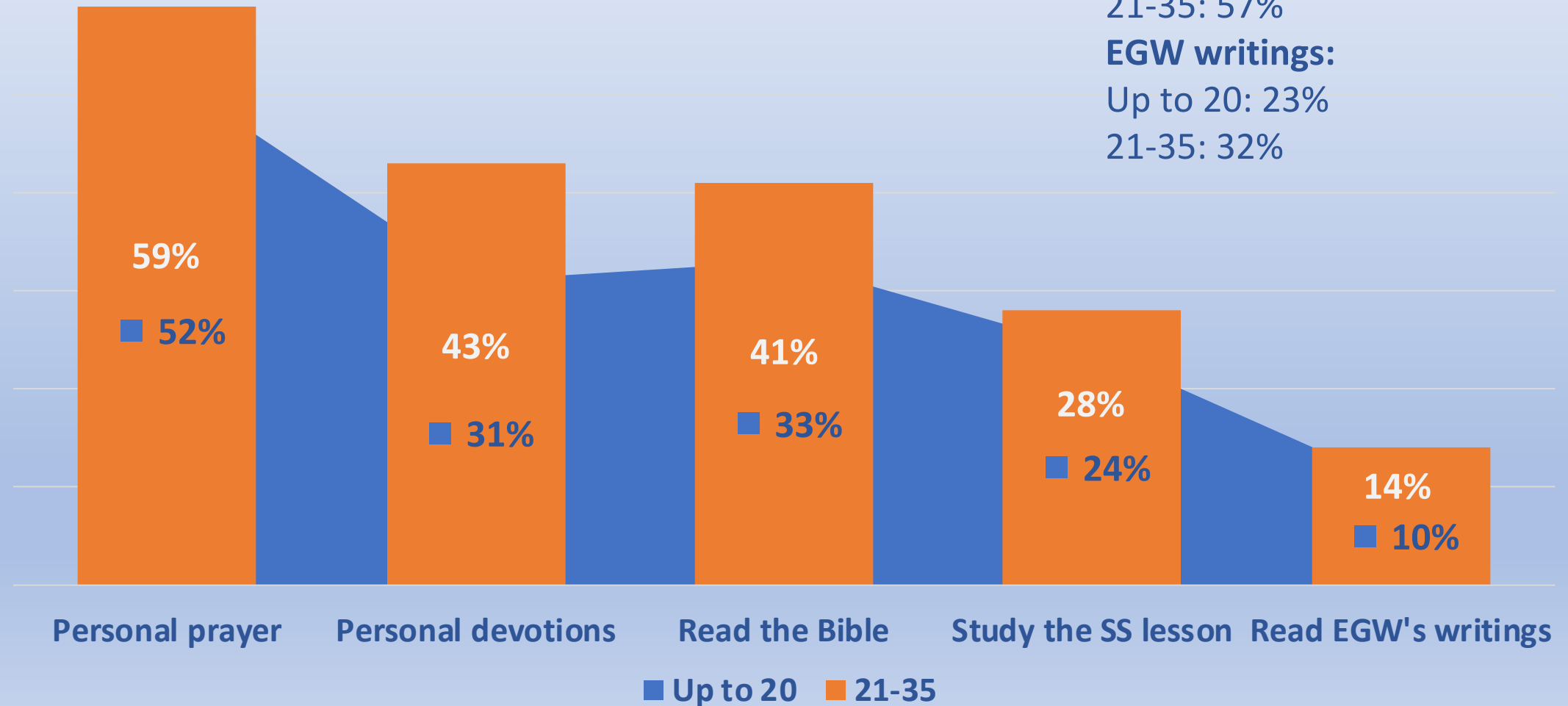

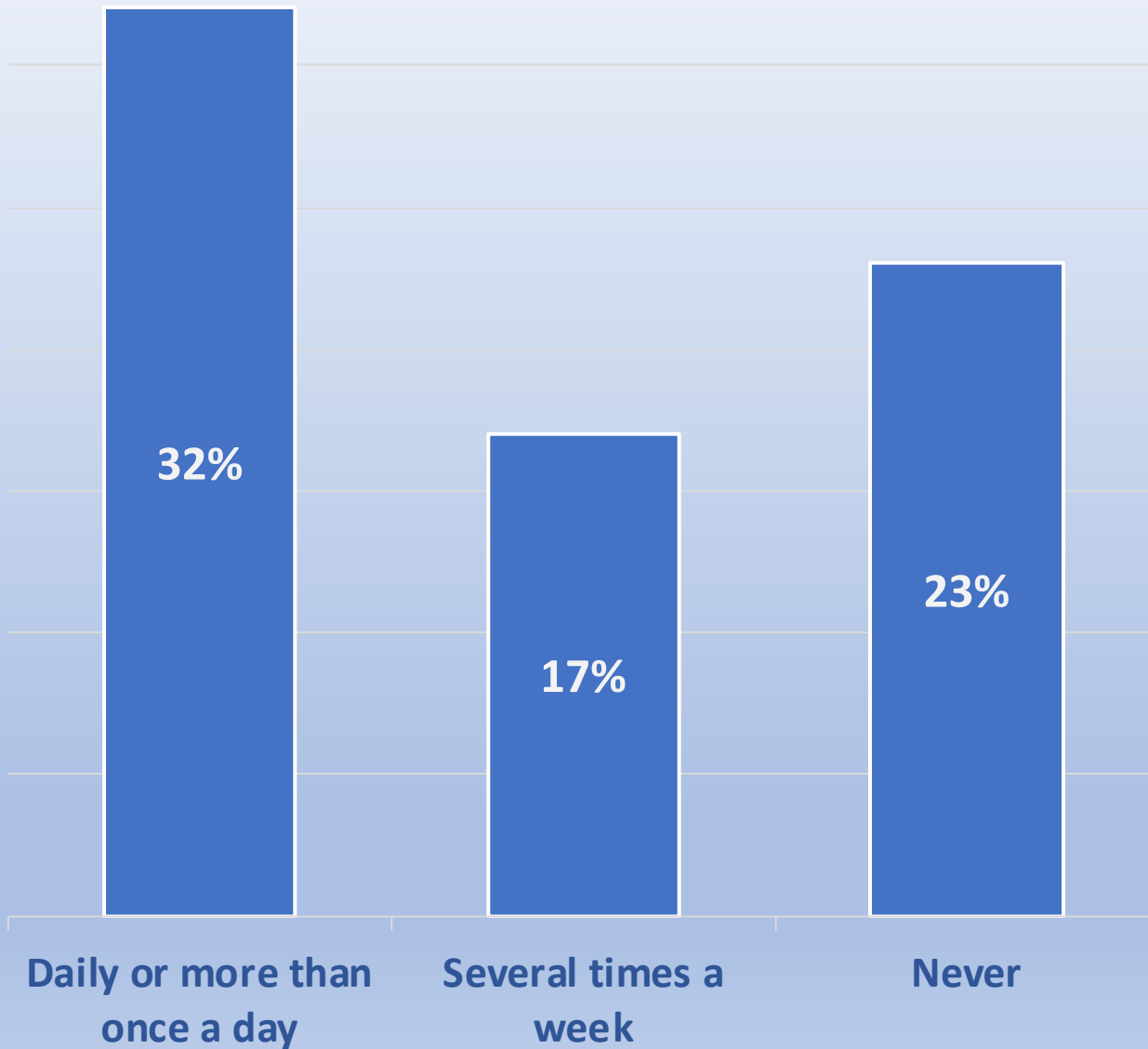

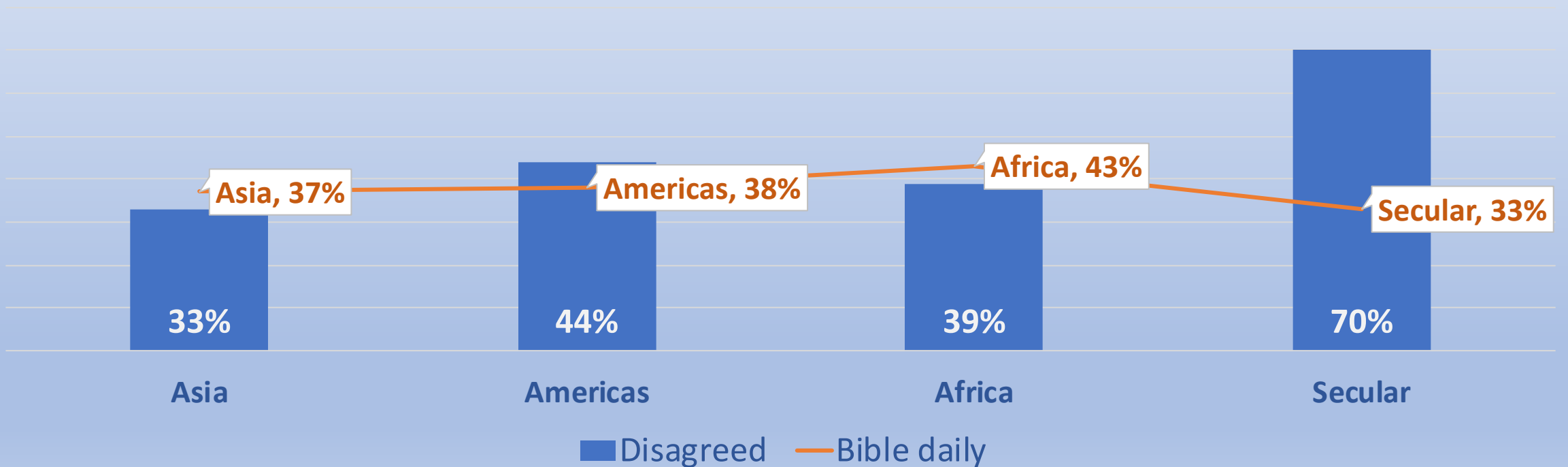


Young Adults:

- 4% of youth have children living with them at home

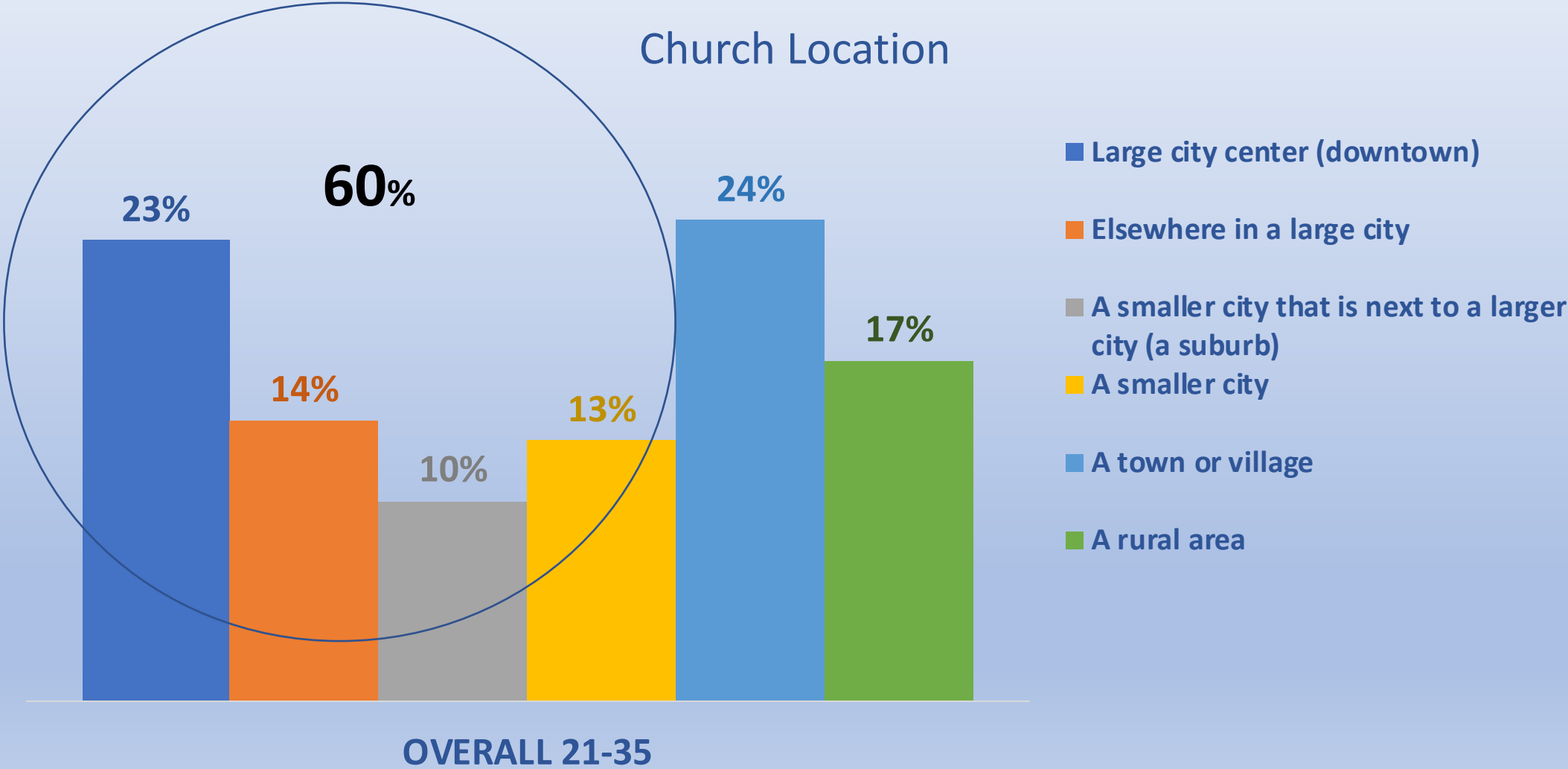
Differences in Responses in Different Cultural Contexts

Ages: 15-35

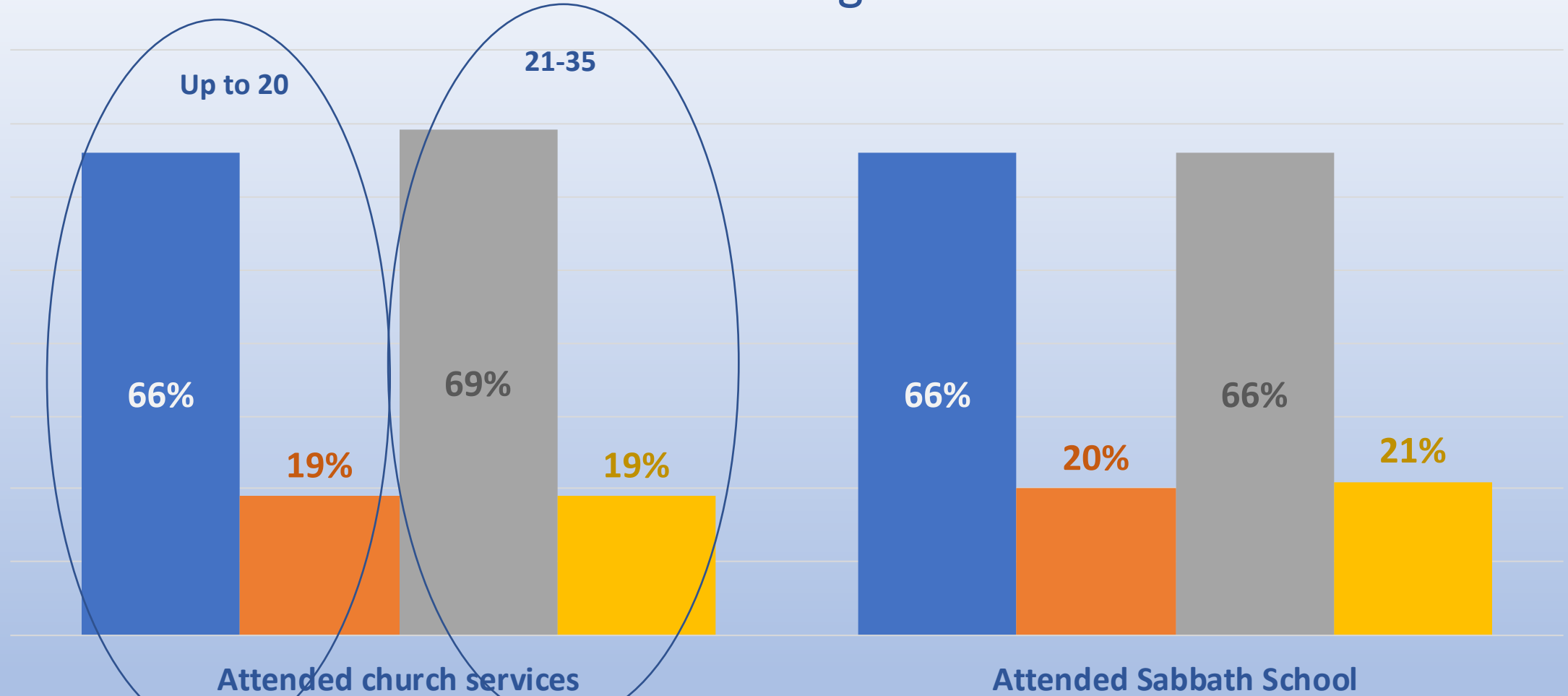

Church Attendance, Location, & Climate

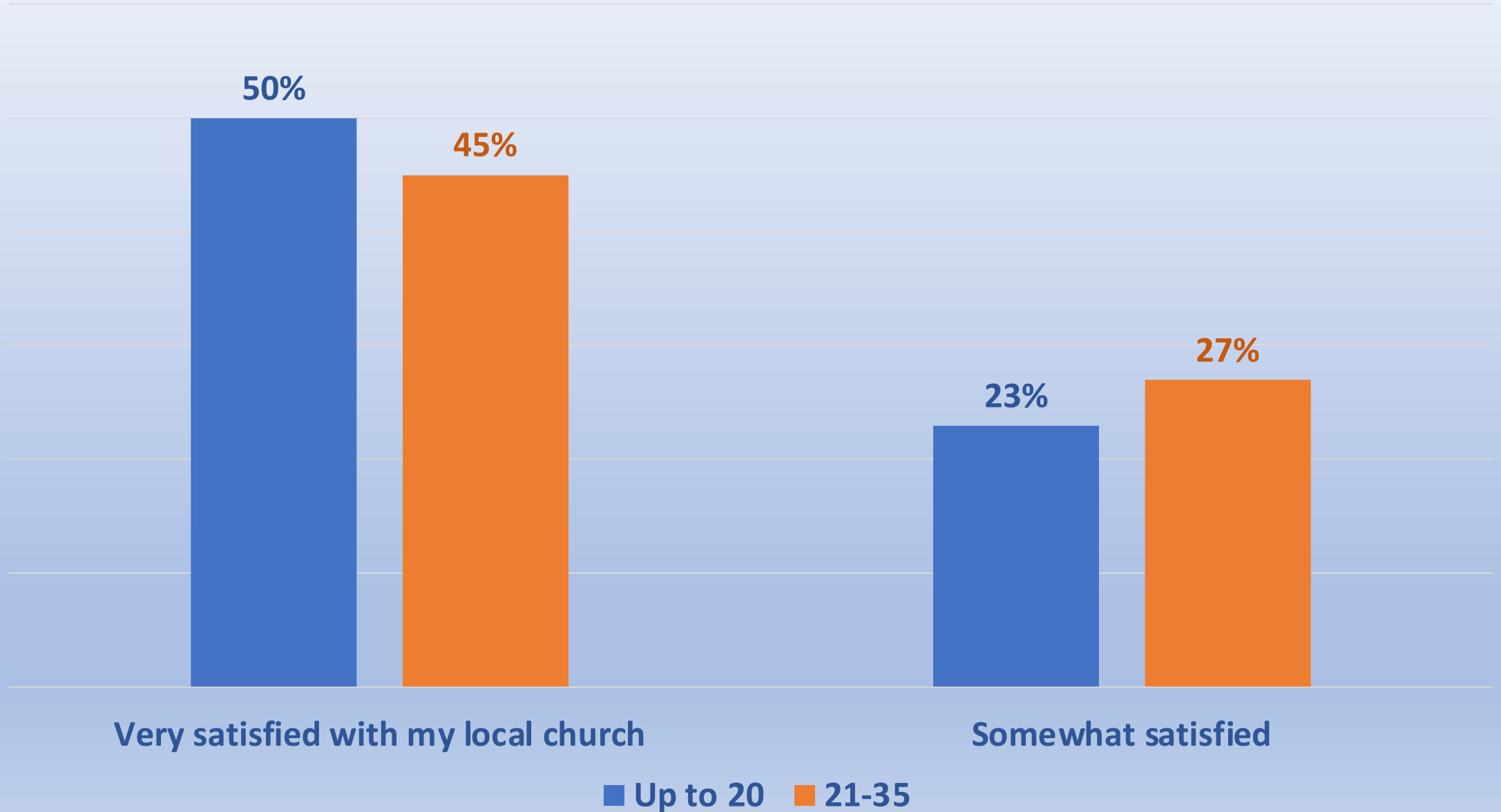


Church attendance during the Last 12 Months



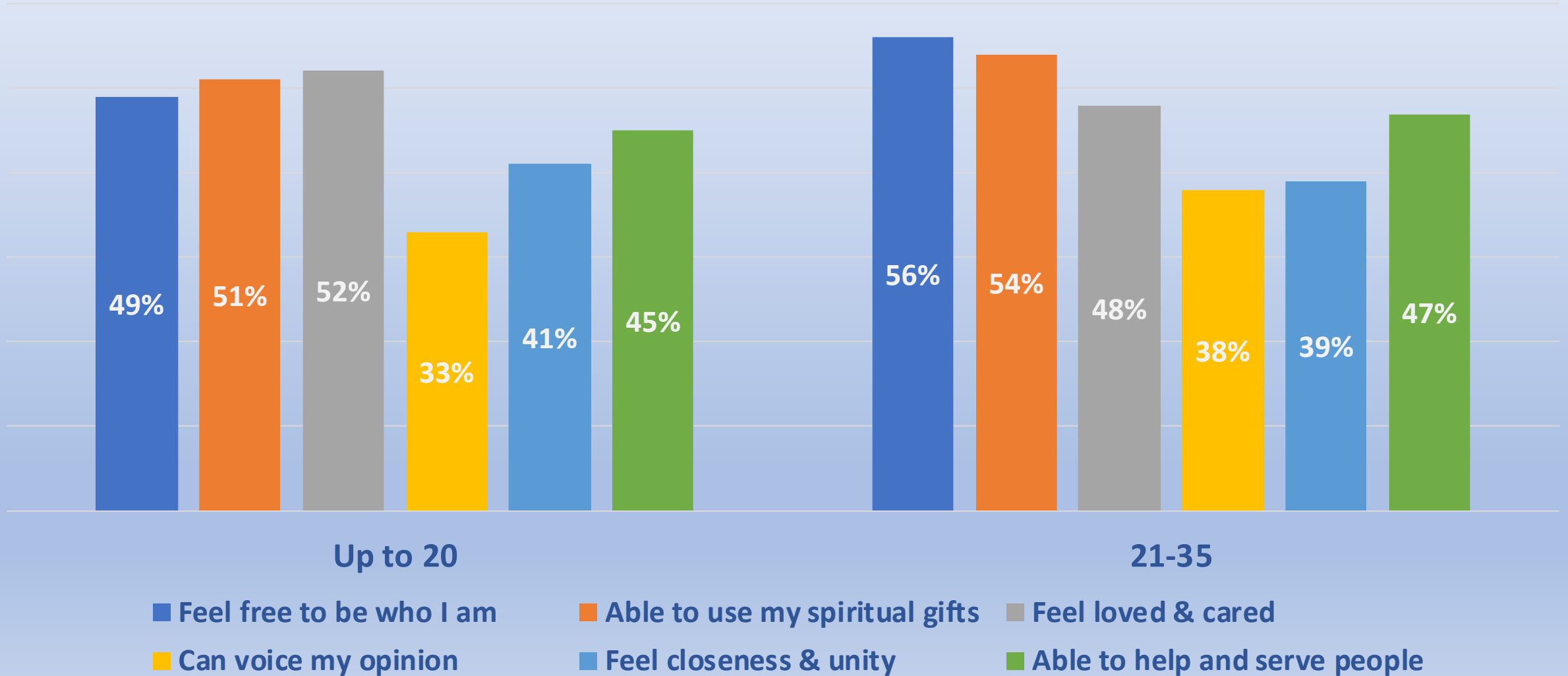
- Every week or more than once a week: up to 20

How Satisfied are you with your Local Church?



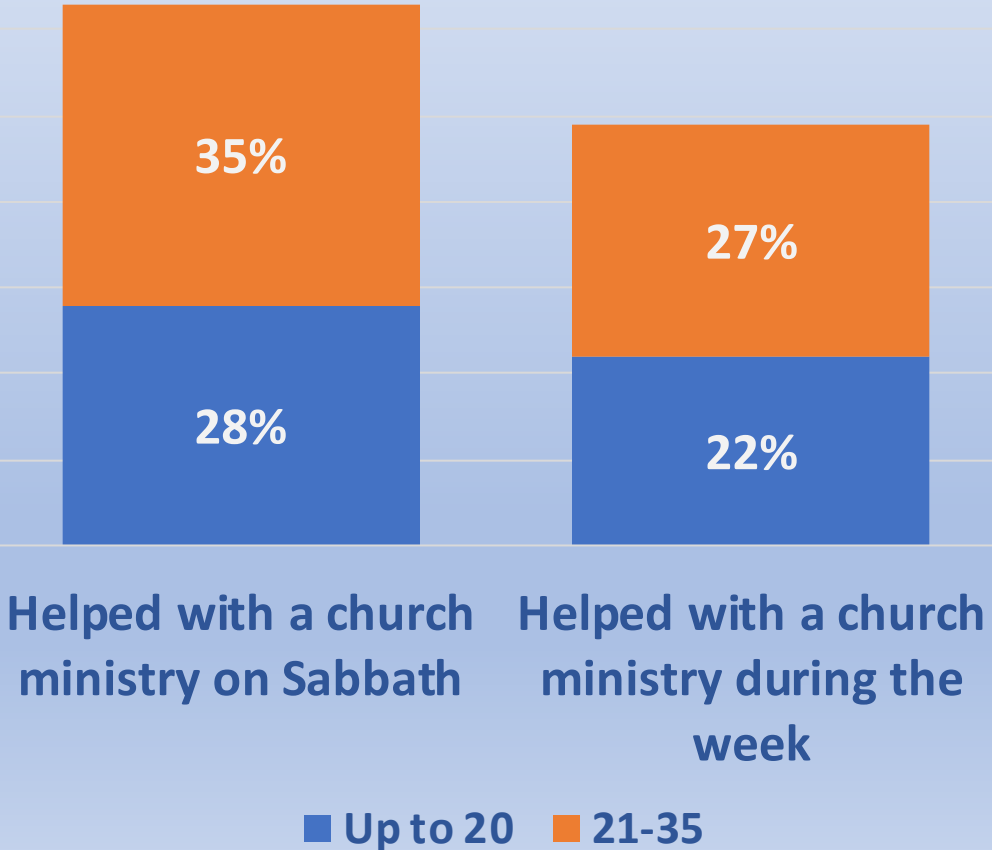

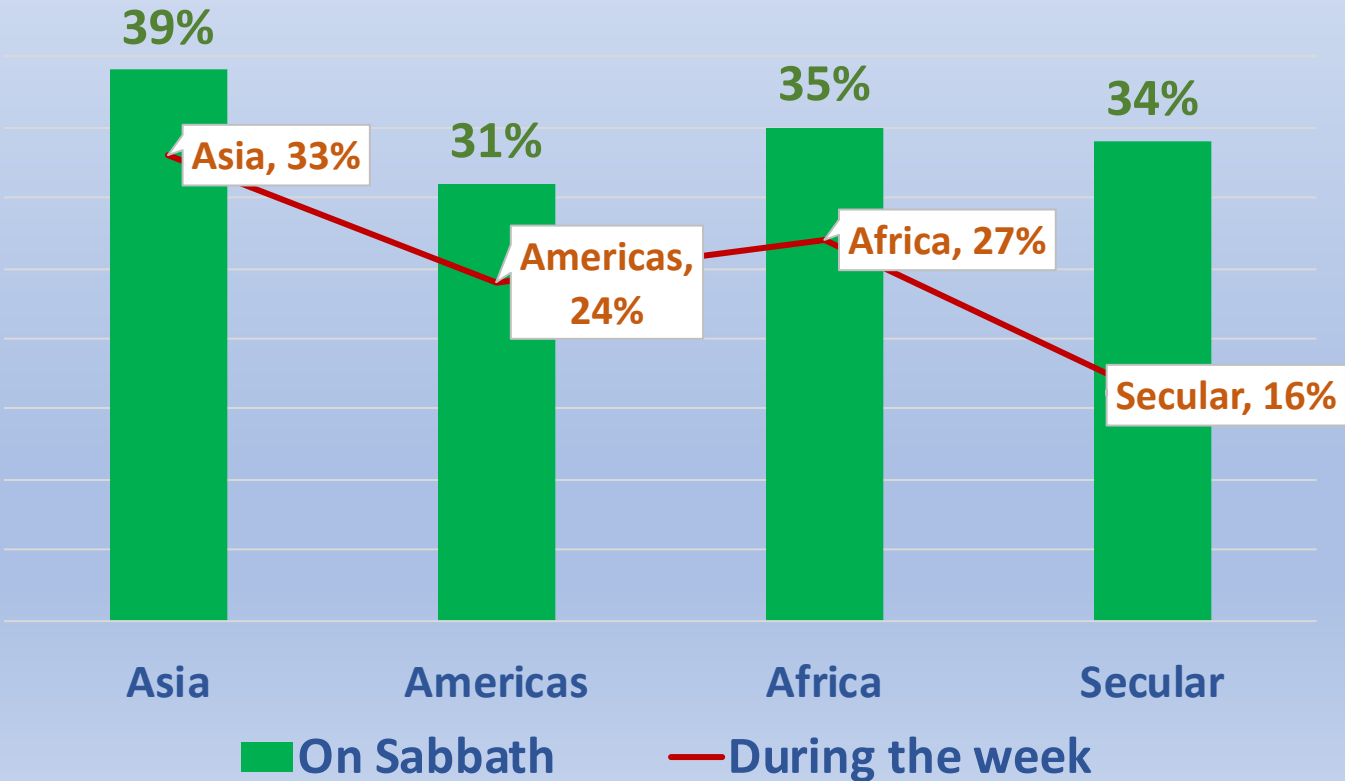

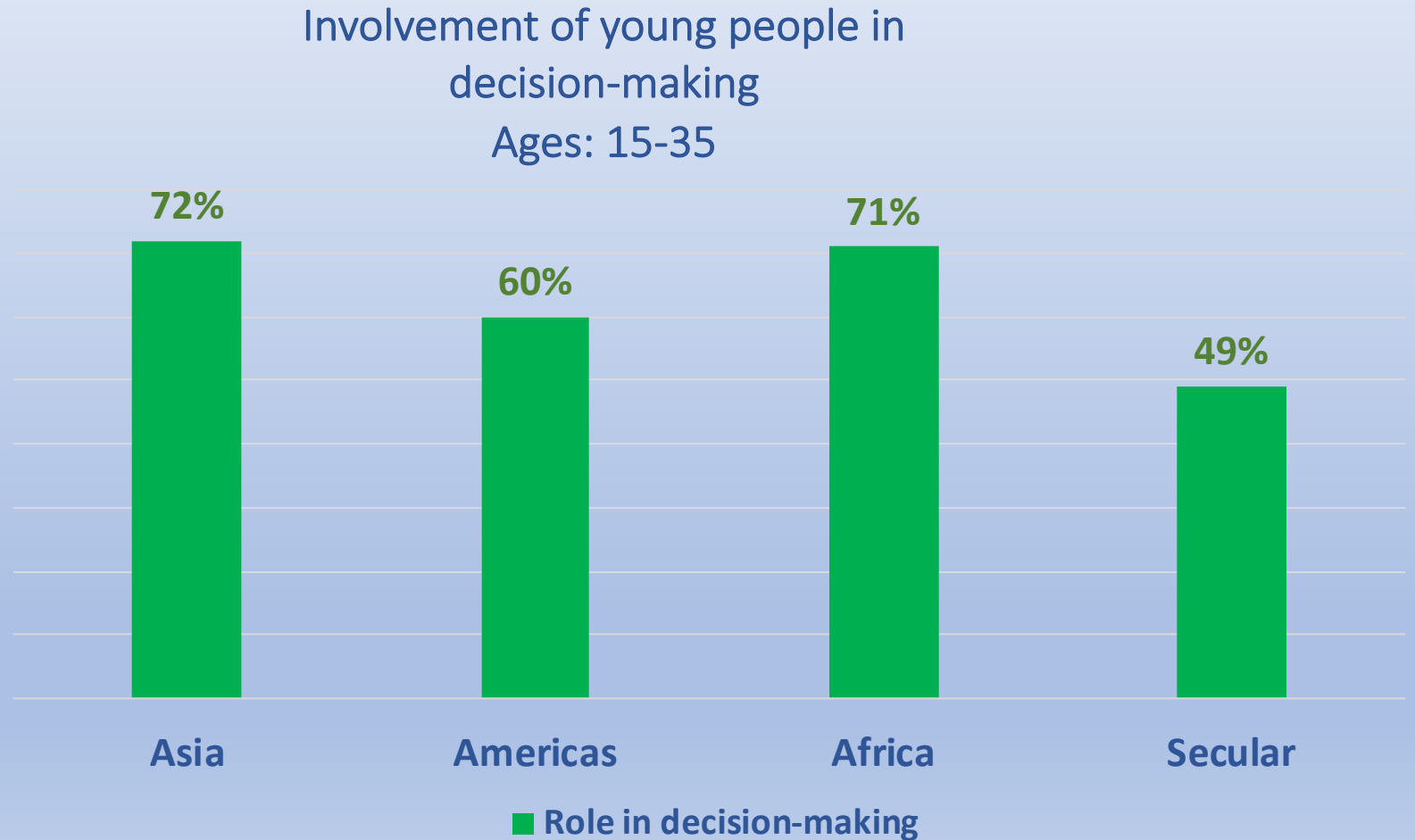
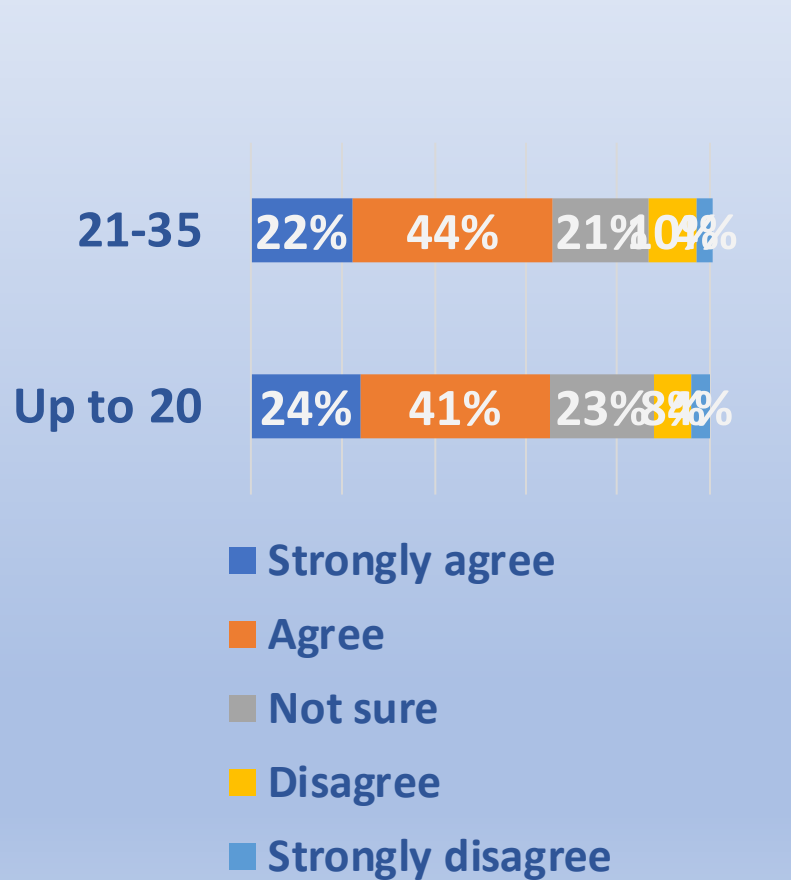
Involvement in Church Ministry during the Last 12 Months
(Every week or more than once a week)



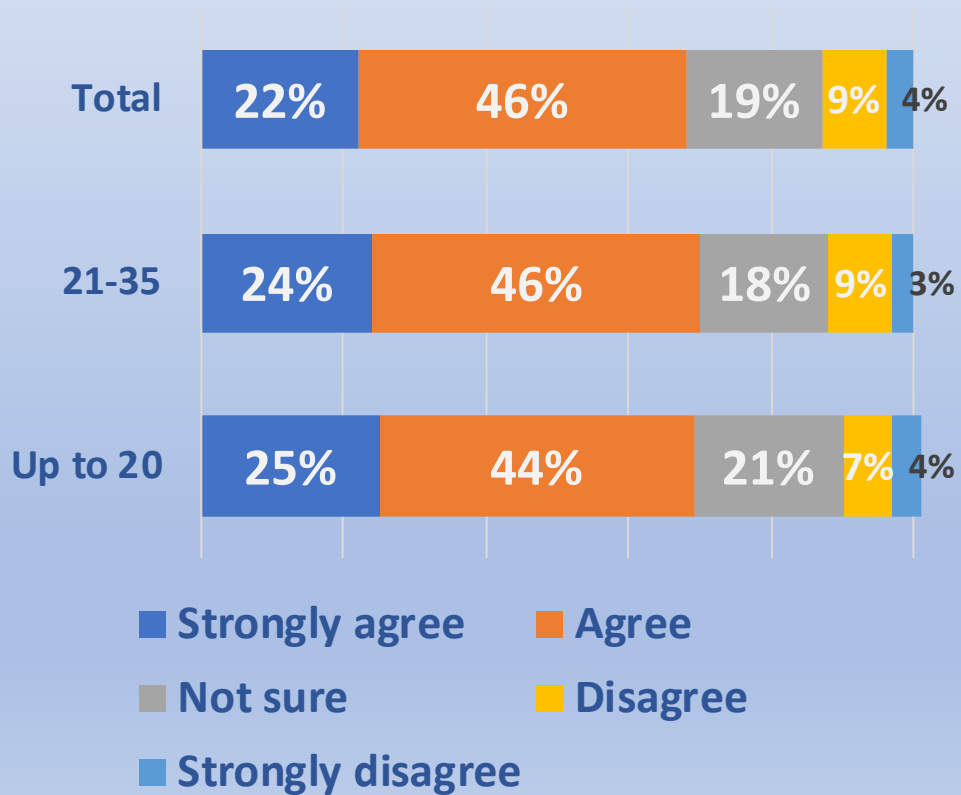

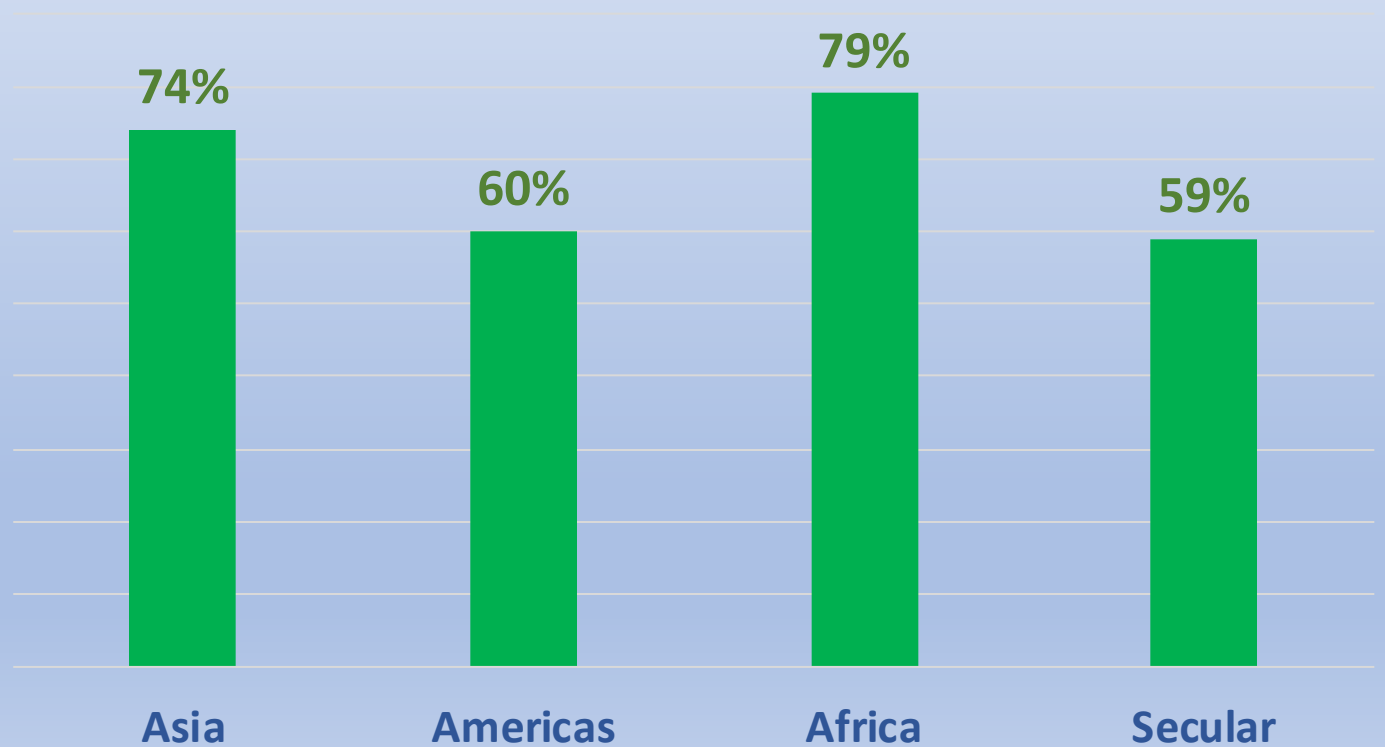
Youth and Young Adults Play an Important Role in Decision-Making in My Local Church



Youth and Young Adults are Actively Involved in Carrying out the Mission of my Local Church (cultural context)

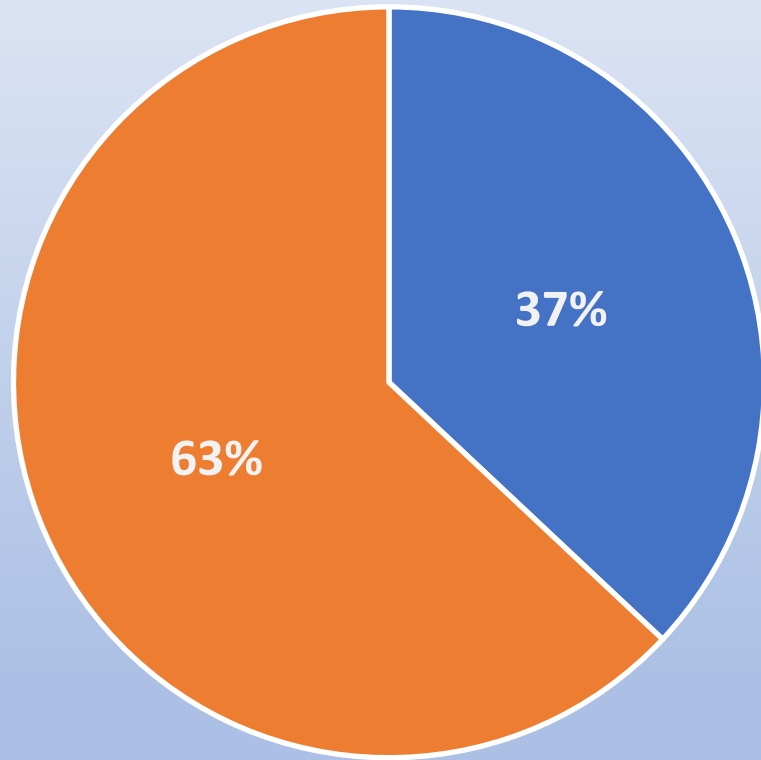


Involvement of Young People in Local Church Mission Ages: 15-35



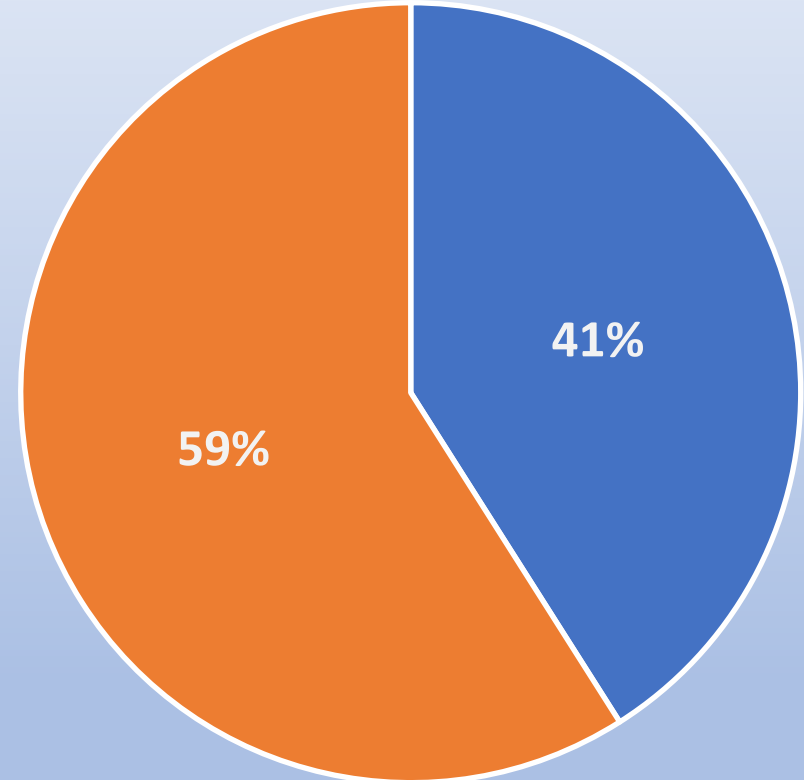

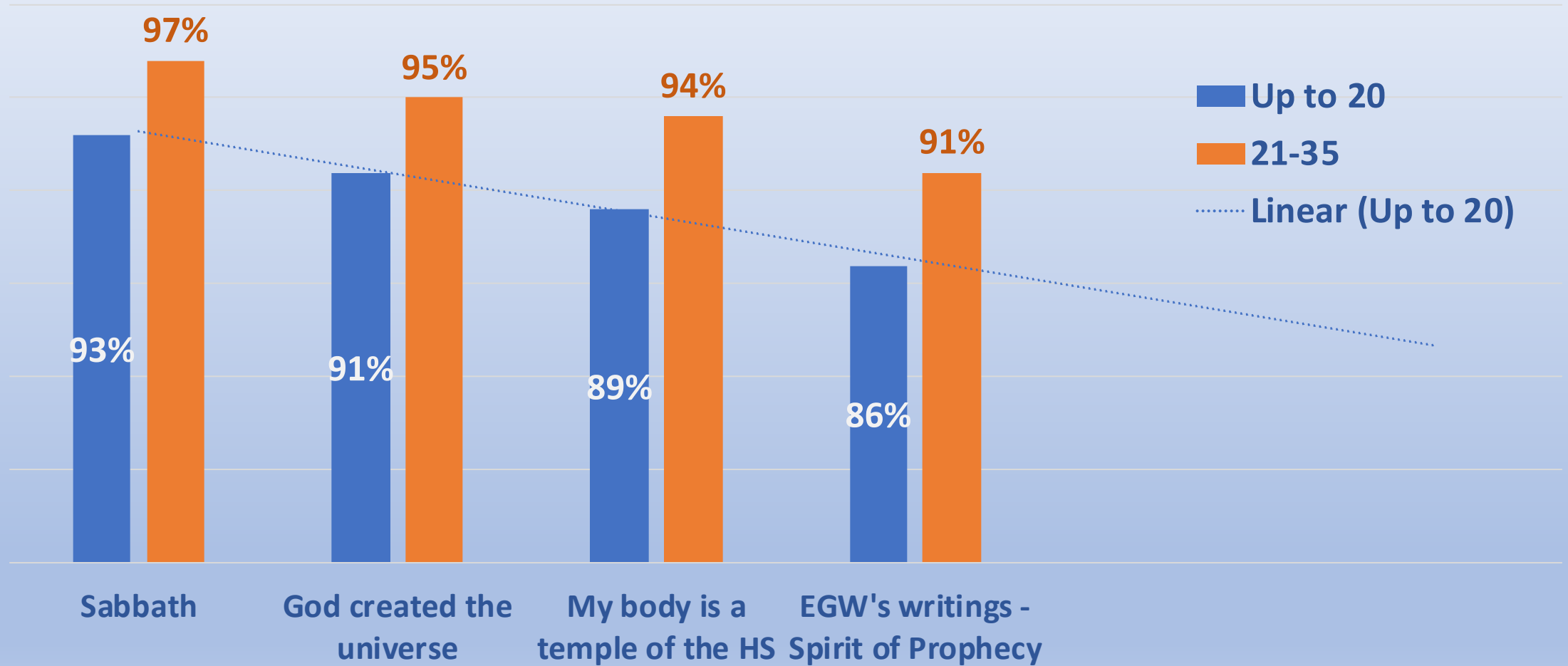

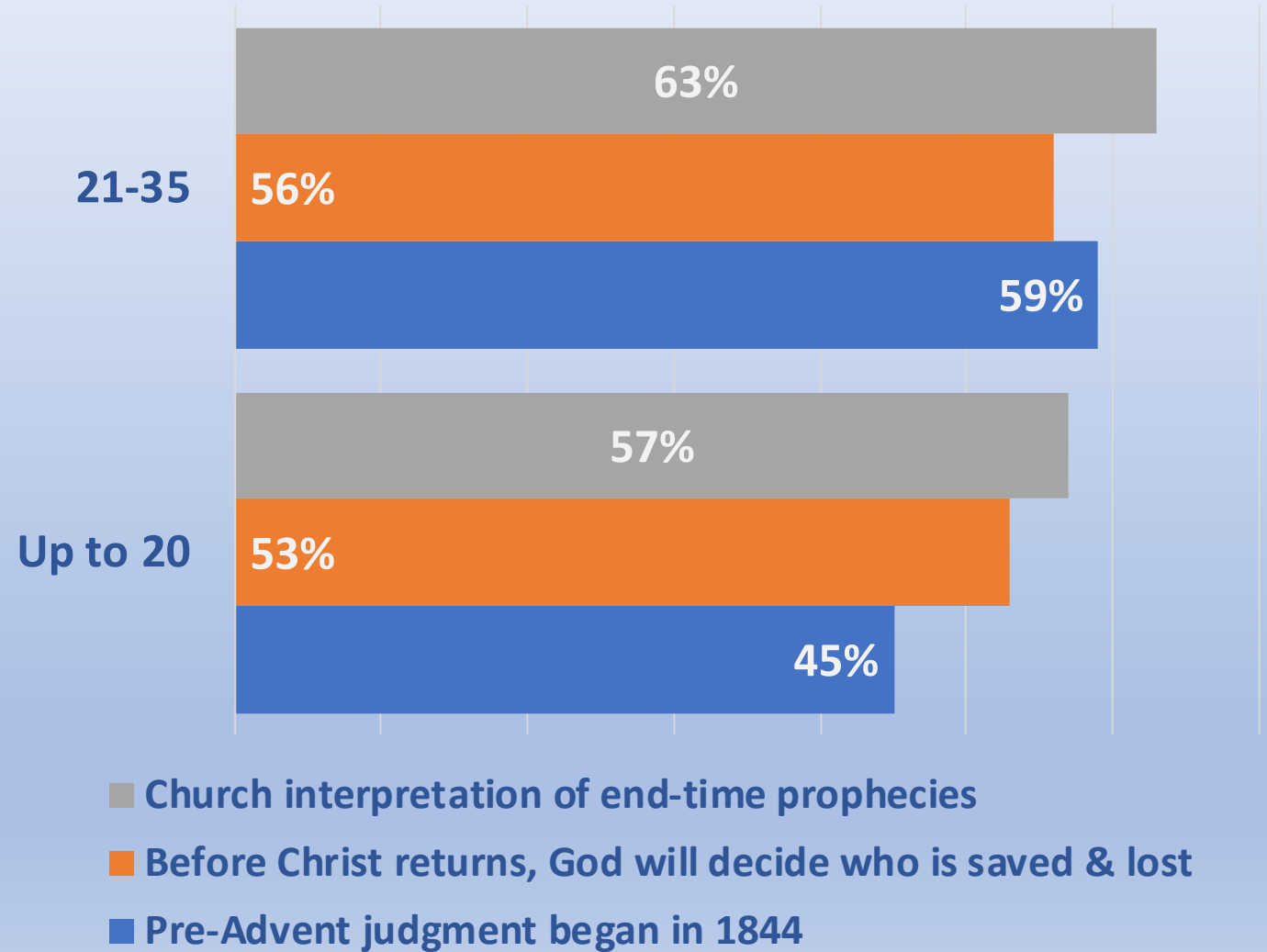
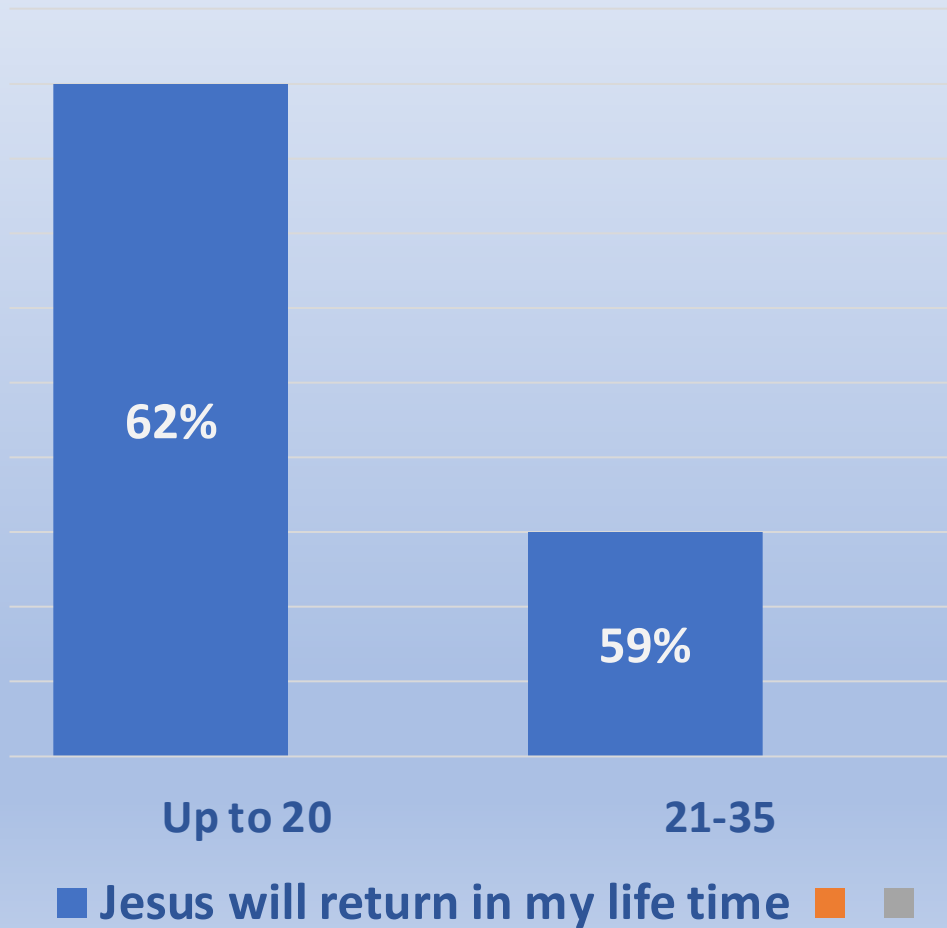
My Church Has a Program for Preparing Young People to Become Leaders (strongly agree or agree)



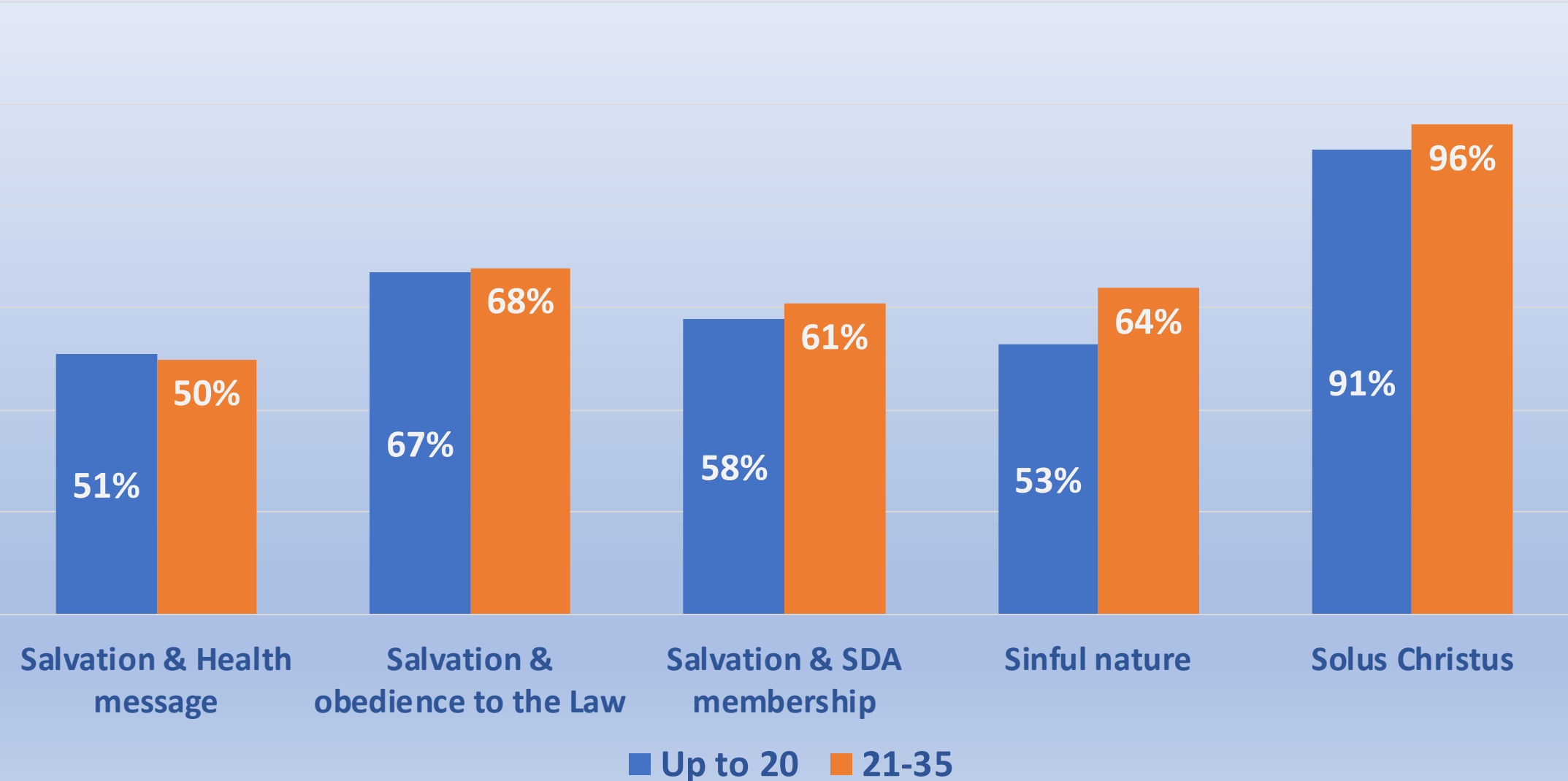

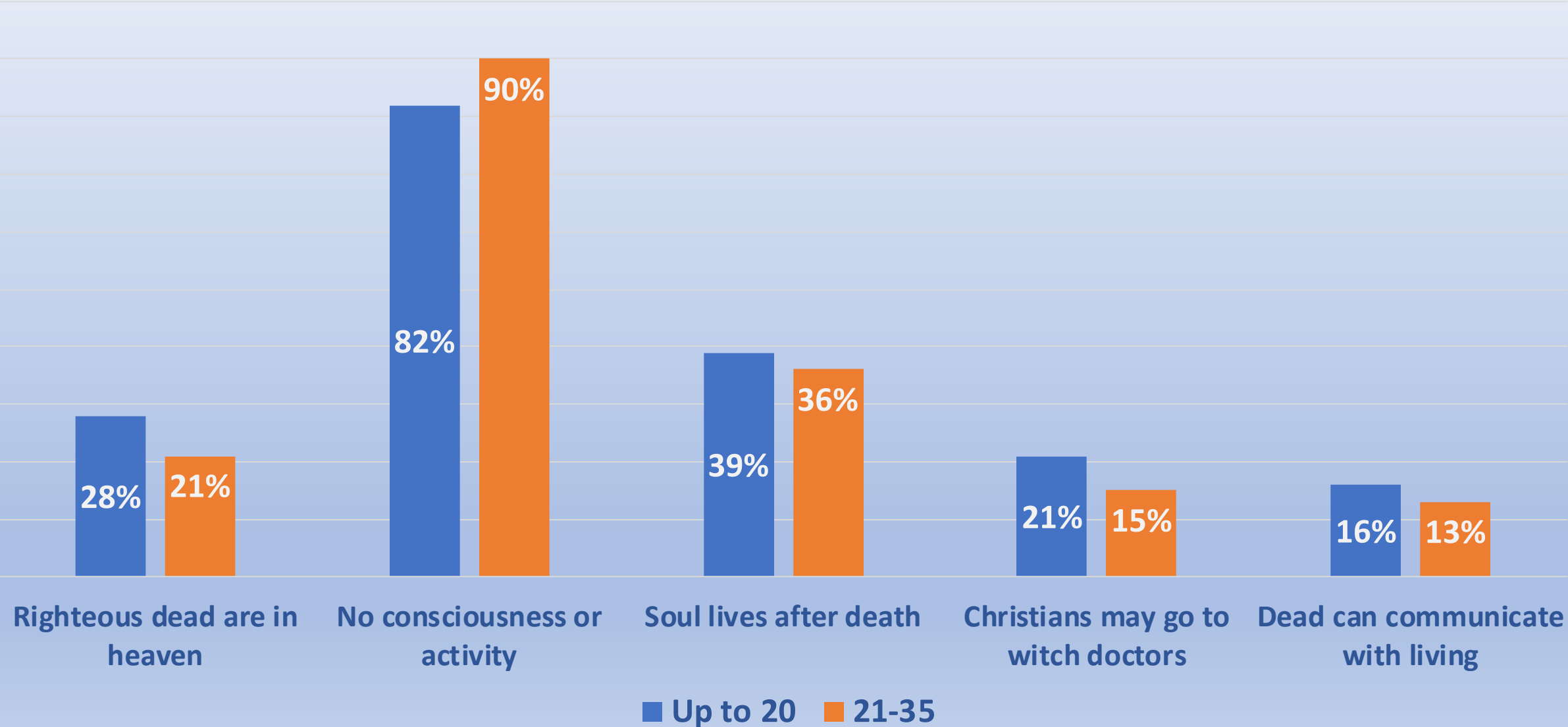

Doctrines: Salvation

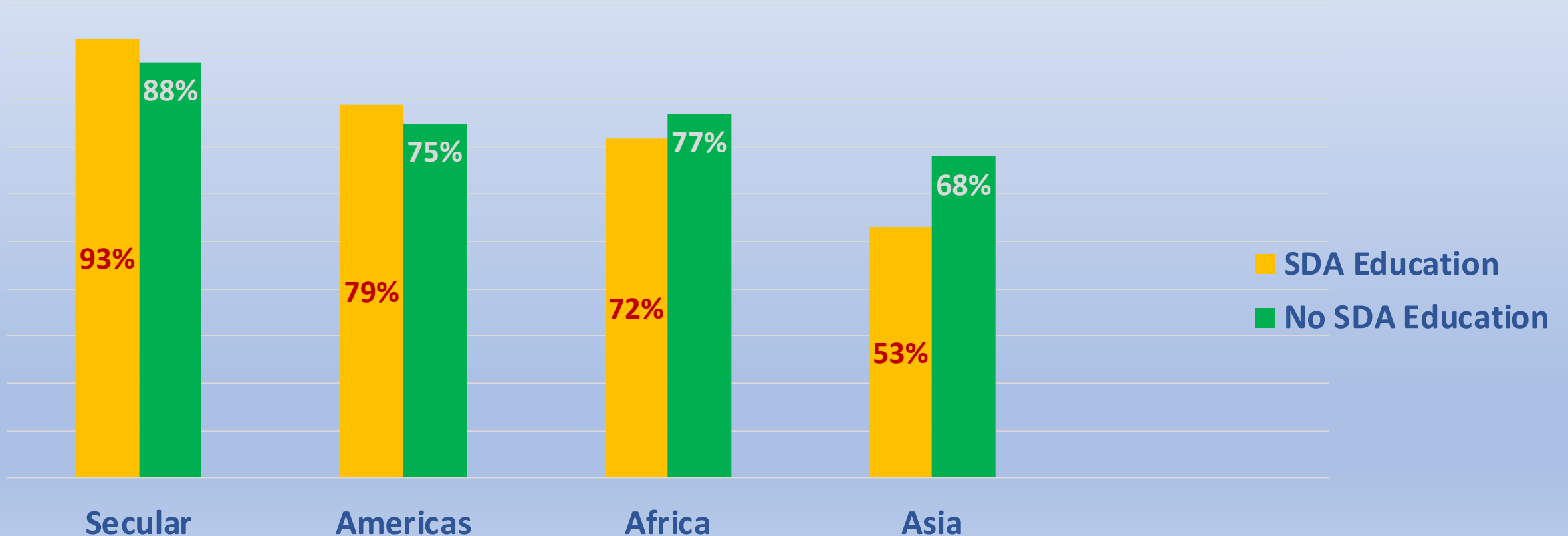


Doctrines: State of the Dead

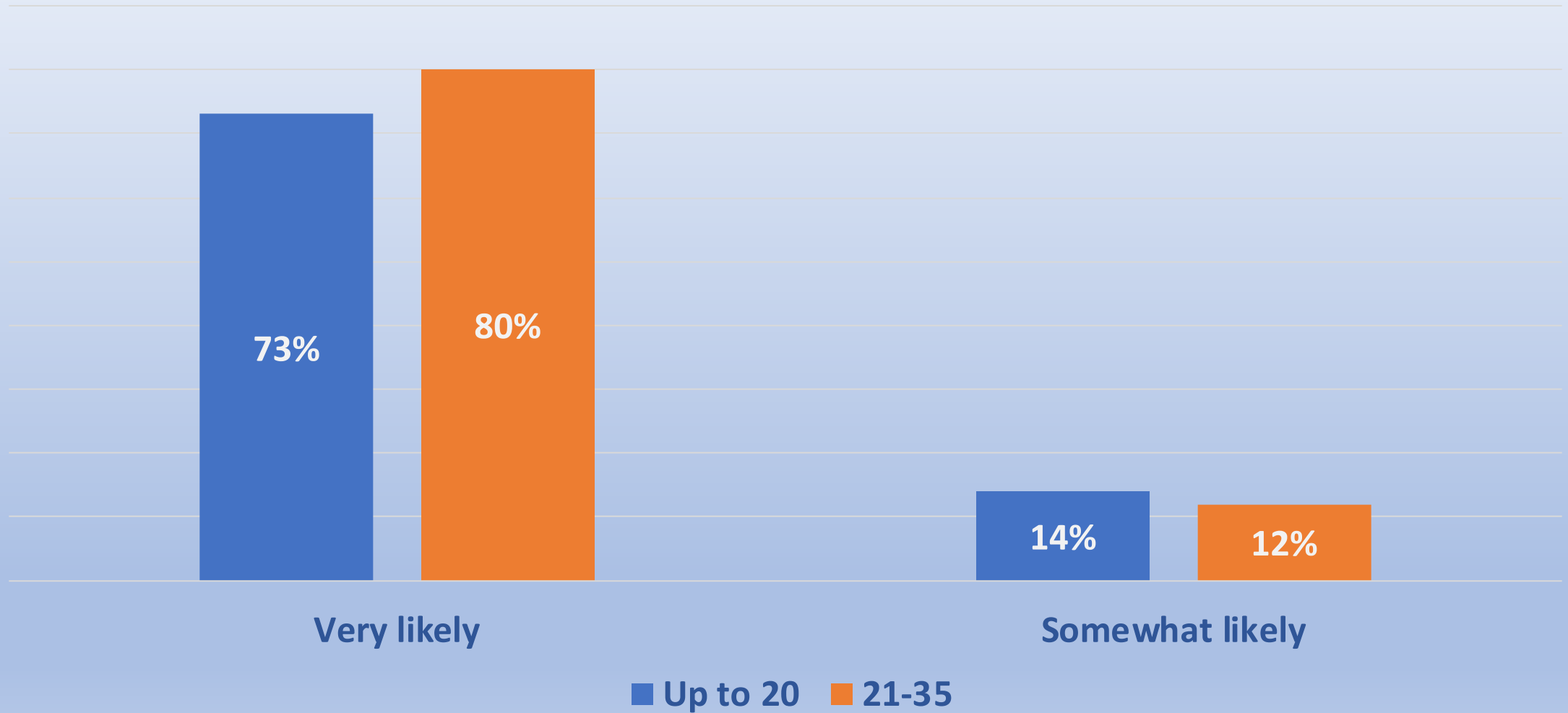


Is there a difference between cultural contexts and SDA education in acceptance of non-Adventist beliefs on the state of the dead?

Conclusions

Faith development happens in the context of home, church, school, and culture; each plays its role. What role?

Room for Improvement:

1. Home: Personal and family devotional life
2. Local churches: young people's satisfaction, safe and friendly climate, young leaders' training especially in Inter and South Americas and secular context, young people's involved in decision making process especially in Inter and South Americas and secular context
3. Local churches: in all contexts intentional involvement of 21-35 age group (Millennials) in ministry with their spiritual gifts on Sabbath and during the week
4. Intentional discipleship of high school and college students in all aspects of their spiritual life, involvement, and service
5. Adventist education: is not available everywhere; not only its presence is important but the content addressing cultural beliefs in local context and doctrinal issues young people are struggling with
6. Special attention to such doctrines as the state of the dead, salvation by grace, sinful nature, pre-advent judgment
7. Application of religious principles by young people to their daily life especially in cultural contexts in Asia, Inter and South America, and Africa
